All BOD positions (except the affiliates and the past commodore) are open to all HSA members in good standing. Our requirement for board participation is that

- 1) You must be willing to serve
- 2) You must live in this area as a permanent resident year-round.

Board member duties include attendance at monthly board meetings, as well as other responsibilities specific to each position. These positions are yearly commitments. Any HSA member may nominate another member for a position, as long as the person nominating has spoken to and received agreement and permission from the nominee to get their name on the ballot. Any HSA member may nominate themselves for a position. Any HSA member wishing to run for a position on the board may do so, even if the current member serving on the board plans to continue serving. The opportunity to serve in each position is open and available to whomever chooses to run for that position each year. Some fun competition and some new blood help keep things lively on the board.
