As we enter September, we have our final Capri and Sunfish classes of 2024 quickly approaching. We also have an opportunity to have a Flying Scot class which I will describe now.

Wes Treco is scheduled to teach the Capri class on Sep 7th-8th. Wes is our top Flying Scot sailor at HSA and he has agreed to teach up to three students in a Flying Scot class that same weekend, Sep 7th-8th. If any members sign up for the Flying Scot, you will sail with Wes and I will then teach the Capri class. The cost will be the same as a Capri class, \$250 per student for the entire weekend, and would be payable by check to HSA on Saturday, Sep 7th when the class starts.

I need to stress that the Flying Scot class is for ADVANCED sailors. If you are relatively new to the sport or haven't sailed in a while, this class is probably not well suited for you, This is because the Flying Scot weighs over 900 pounds and you must sail them away from and back to the dock. If a skipper misjudges their approach to the dock, the possibility of serious damage cannot be ignored. That said, they are very stable and fun boats to sail, and they don't capsize. If you are an experienced sailor looking to add a fun boat to your HSA repertoire, you should really consider this opportunity.

If we do not have any members sign up for the Flying Scot, then Wes will teach the Capri class, which has two people signed up as of August 28th.
